

The classification assigned is utilized by insurance companies to determine insurance premiums and range from Class 1 to Class 10. Kannapolis Fire Department has an ISO rating of Class 4.

The fire department is continually improving methods to become a more efficient and effective team to support the community. The department sets goals and measures job performance through performance indicators. These objectives, set by the Fire Chief, are evaluated on a yearly basis to analyze any processes requiring improvements as part of the budget process.

The fire department is able to respond quickly and effectively to meet the needs of citizens. Technical Services Division


Chief K. Beard, Technical Services Chief




