Free public parking is also available in these lots: Oak Ave., Kannapolis Train Station, North Main Street, NCRC Deck, City Hall,

Chestnut Ave., University, Watson Crick Dr., Wellness Way, South Main Street and RCCC.

The **Oak Avenue** lot is located within a five-minute walk to downtown shops, restaurants and Atrium Health Ballpark. The Oak Avenue lot has 60 parking spaces, including

handicap-accessible options. Parking is free in this lot.

Amtrak passengers who need to park overnight in the Train Station/Main Street Parking Lot do not need a parking permit. Handicap parking is available along West Avenue, in each City parking lot and the VIDA deck.

The City has added two **passenger dropoff and pick-up locations** in downtown. These locations are to be used by rideshare passengers or anyone who simply needs to drop off or pick up passengers. The two locations are at the Gem Theatre on Laureate Way, and at the Swanee Theatre on Cannon Baller Way. The locations are signed "no parking" and "no loading" areas.

Visiting downtown on a Friday or Saturday from April to November? Hop on the **West Avenue Express!** Two electric shuttles –

Thunder and Lightning – run from 5–10

p.m., Friday–Saturday, April through



December, on a continuous loop between four designated stops: the NCRC public parking deck, the top of the horseshoe sidewalk, First Baptist Church and the Swanee Theatre. A shuttle will arrive at each stop approximately every five minutes. Both shuttles are ADA-accessible and free to the public.

# KANNAPOLIS FIREFIGHTERS ACHIEVE PRESTIGIOUS DESIGNATION

Kannapolis firefighters Wesley Rigdon and Cody Clark have completed the rigorous Georgia Smoke Diver program, the first Kannapolis firefighters to do so. They are two of only four other firefighters in North Carolina who have ever completed the program. The class of 42 members was selected from 650 applicants and only 11 completed the course requirements.

The Georgia Smoke Diver Course is a six-day, 60-hour program designed for realistic training in self-survival, firefighter rescue, advanced search & rescue, thermal imaging, emergency procedures, teamwork, discipline, team leadership, situational awareness and decision-making, as well as how to function within the elements of the Incident Command System. It began in 1978 to decrease firefighter injuries and deaths in the field. Participants pay to take this optional course, which begins with a stringent physical and mental pretest.



The program condenses and replicates the extreme demands that may be placed on firefighters at any incident. Emphasis is placed on the day-to-day challenges firefighters face at structure fires, multiple-alarm fires and multiple fires within a single shift. These same principles can be applied to the performance of duties at natural disasters, catastrophic events and acts of terrorism.

The course is physically demanding and mentally challenging. Its design allows each candidate to understand and manage their physical and mental limitations under safe but stressful realistic conditions. Everything, from the amount and type of food and drink, is also monitored throughout the course as part of the lessons learned.

Wesley, a fire engineer, joined the Kannapolis Fire Department in 2017. Cody, a firefighter, joined in 2019. Both are at Station 3. Wesley is married to Ashley, who is a Captain at Fire Station 1 and they have two children. Cody comes from a firefighting family; his father and brother are both firefighters.
