KANNAPOLIS DAM SPILLWAY SCHEDULED FOR REPLACEMENT

The City of Kannapolis has an extensive water resources system that provides our residents with clean, safe drinking water every day. The City operates a water treatment plant, a dam, and more than 335 miles of water lines and 325 miles of sewer lines.

Our water supply comes from these primary sources – Lake Kannapolis, Lake Howell and water received from Salisbury, Albemarle and Concord. On average, residents and



businesses in the City use 5.5 million gallons of water daily. Our capacity is 15 million gallons a day.

The City's water treatment plant operates 24 hours a day. The Kannapolis Lake Dam was originally constructed in 1940 and is located on Irish Buffalo Creek near Pump

Station Road. Water from the lake feeds into the water treatment plant and is treated and tested before it flows into residents' homes and businesses. Due to its age and damage over the years from large rain events, the dam will be replaced later this year.

Water levels will be drawn down, demolition of the old spillway will occur and the construction of a new dam spillway will take place.

The dam spillway will be more than 40 feet in height and have a maximum capacity of 5,931 acre-feet. The project is expected to cost approximately \$8.4 million and it will take a year to complete.



ANNUAL POLICE DEPARTMENT AWARDS PRESENTED

Several members of the Kannapolis Police Department were recently honored for their work. The most prestigious awards were given by the department based on service and performance to residents and to fellow police officers.



Officer Jody Kerr was presented with the Roger Dale Carter Memorial Service Award, given in memory of Kannapolis Police Officer Carter, who died in the line of duty in 1993. This award is presented

annually to a sworn officer who has shown exceptional service to residents and his peers, and whose character and integrity exemplify the highest ideals of law enforcement.



Records Specialist Susan Martin was awarded the Norma C. Howard Memorial Service Award. Norma Howard was the first female and full-time civilian police employee in Kannapolis and was instrumental in establishing the records management system.

This award is presented annually to a civilian police department employee who conducts both their personal and professional lives in a manner that is consistent with the department's values and code of ethics.



Officer Andrew Brouillette was presented with the Rookie of the Year Award.

The Rookie of the Year Award is presented annually to a sworn or civilian employee who has been employed with the Police

Department for less than three years, and who demonstrates a strong work ethic, positive attitude and willingness to work cooperatively. He played an instrumental role coordinating with other law enforcement agencies to uncover a ring of shoplifting suspects who were stealing high-end Lego sets.



Officer Austin Purser was presented with the Traffic Safety Award. This award is presented annually to the sworn employee who has made a great impact in improving highway and traffic safety in

Kannapolis. He also recently received a MADD DWI Enforcer Award for his 88 DWI arrests in 2024.



Officer John Cramer was awarded the Team Above Self Award. This award is presented to the officer who displays a high level of teamwork and who always puts the needs of the

agency, squad, team and shift ahead of their own needs.



Sergeant Chris Hamilton was awarded the Leadership Award. This award is presented annually to the supervisor, either sworn or civilian, who best displays the leadership

traits that help to further the mission of the department.
