NEW LIBRARY AND ACTIVE LIVING CENTER OPENS

The new Cabarrus County Library and Active Living Center at Afton Ridge in Kannapolis – the first County facility in the area – is now open.

The 40,000-square-foot facility features space for fitness activities like dance classes, yoga, tai chi and games, along with convenient access to a wide variety of reading

materials, private study rooms and more. The space reinforces the notion that education, recreation and community engagement are essential for a thriving community.

There are 55,000 new items on the shelves, 17 staff members, a large programming room, study spaces, quiet reading areas, Internet computers, printing and free Wi-Fi. The library

welcomes volunteers and is looking for people to join our Friends Board.

A vast array of fitness machines and an outdoor space that features bocce and shuffleboard are also available for public use.


