


Tree Lighting Ceremony & Celebration of Lights at 6 p.m., Saturday, November 16, at Village Park at 700 West C Street.

LOOSE LEAF COLLECTION TO BEGIN

ity of Kannapolis loose leaf collection will begin October 28, 2024, and end March 17, _2025.

Loose Leaf Collection Do's & Don'ts:

- Leaves must be placed at the curb or along the ditch line not in ditches in rows parallel
- Place leaves at the curb by 7 a.m. on the day of collection.
- Leaves mixed with limbs, other yard waste, gum balls, gravel, glass or other solid matter will not be collected.
- Leaves in garbage containers will not be collected.
- Leaves must be clear of water meters and fences and placed on the street side of retaining walls.
- Leaves must be clear of sidewalks/street.

Keep the area around the leaves clear of vehicles and other items so the loose leaf vacuum trucks can easily access the leaves. If access to the leaves is blocked, the leaves will not be collected.

During loose leaf season, there will be no loose leaf collection on the following holidays: Veteran's Day (Nov. 11), Thanksgiving (Nov. 28 and 29), Christmas (Dec. 24, 25 and 26), New Year's Day (Jan. 1) and Martin Luther King Day (Jan. 20). After March 17, we request that you bag any loose leaves you have and place them at the curb for yard waste collection.
