
### PROJECT OVERVIEW

Downtown Kannapolis was drastically changed with the closing of Pillowtex Mills. In its place, a developer David Murdock and the City of Kannapolis began the transformation of the former mill into a state of the art research campus.

Over the last twenty years Kannapolis has systematically been developing new parks and greenways in and around the downtown area. Park development mainly focused on renovating and expanding existing parks and developing new parks where land was available. Now that the downtown area is starting to shape up the city is looking to invest resources in outlying areas of the city.

Kannapolis recently completed a comprehensive park and recreation masterplan to identify where new park development will be needed for other regions around the city. This masterplan recommended development of new Community and Neighborhood Parks in four different regions around the city. The eastside of Kannapolis is one of the recommended areas for development of a new park.

Using its' comprehensive park and recreation master plan as a guide the city began looking for land in eastern region of Kannapolis that would be suitable for recreation development. Keeping the need for passive recreation in mind the city identified a tract of land bordering Lake Fisher. The city purchased 33+/- acres of land for development of a community park with water access in the Midlake Community.





### **PARK HISTORY**

The Eastside Park site is located on Midlake Avenue in east Kannapolis. Kannapolis acquired the land from the property owner shortly before the site was to be developed as a residential subdivision. Today the 33+/-acre park site is surrounded by residential subdivisions and Lake Fisher.


The closet downtown park is 3.5 - 4 miles away. Beaver Pond, Mallard Pointe, Loch Moor, several other subdivisions, and single-family homes border the park to the north, south, and west. Several thousand people within a couple miles of the park need a place to recreate.

The City's vision in acquiring this park to serve the citizens of eastern Kannapolis is to develop a wellrounded park that meets the growing demand for passive recreation along with providing water access. Until the city acquired Lake Fisher there was no public water access for Kannapolis citizens.

### SITE ANALYSIS: MAN MADE FEATURES

### **Existing Park Facilties**

The park property does not contain any structure or existing facilities.

### **Existing Utilities**

The City of Kannapolis has an existing public 8" water main in Midlake Avenue that is available to serve the park. Existing sanitary sewer is available to serve the park.

The City of Kannapolis has an existing 16" sanitary sewer line within a 30-foot easement along the shoreline of Lake Fisher.

### **Archaeological / Historical Sites**

No significant cultural/historical sites are known to occur on or near the proposed park area per www. nationalregisterofhistoric places.com/NC/Cabarrus accessed on March 21, 2019.

### **Zoning / Surrounding Land Use**

Eastside Park is zoned RM-2 (Residential Medium Density) and the properties adjoining the park are zoned RM-2. According to the present UDO a neighborhood park is a permitted use. A conditional use permit is required to develop a non-neighborhood type public park for the RM-2 district.

Additionally a small strip of land is owned by Cabarrus County between the park and Lake Fisher itself.

### Setbacks

Various setback per the Kannapolis UDO will apply to the project. Setback dimensions vary depending on the zoning classification. The RM-2 zoning classification requires a 25-foot front, 10-foot side yard, and 25foot rear setback for principal structures.

Due to the close proximity to residential properties a 50-foot "voluntary buffer is recommended for all park boundaries.

### **Roads / Access**

The park is bordered by Midlake Avenue to the west. Midlake Avenue is a local street regulated by NCDOT. There is an existing paved driveway serving the city owned pump station. This existing drive creates a good opportunity for a shared access between the two facilities.

### **SITE ANALYSIS: NATURAL FEATURES**

### **Hydrology**

Lake Fisher, a jurisdictional water, borders the eastern edge of the park. The lake is a 534-acre water supply reservoir for the City of Concord (WS-IV; CA). Lake Fisher has a watershed protection overlay district. The maximum built upon area is 24%. A minimum 50-foot undisturbed buffer will be required along the shoreline of Lake Fisher.

The lake outfalls south into Cold Water Creek which empties into Rocky River south of Concord which eventually empties into the Pee Dee River in the Norwood area.

Portions of the site is located within the 100-year flood plain or within the floodway of Lake Fisher. Flood plain land generally follows the shore line of Lake Fisher. The UDO will require a floodplain development permit for any park development in the floodplain. Refer to the North Carolina Flood Risk Information System for more information about the location of the flood plain relative to the park.

According to DWQ Mooresville the NC Administrative Code 15A NCAC 02B.0216 regulates recreational activities on the lake. But the City of Concord is responsible for administering (enforcement) of the NCAC regulations for the lake itself. Per the City of Concord Water Resources Department paddle boats and a small dock will be allowable for the park provided the City of Kannapolis monitors the activity. The general public can not bring boats from off site and launch them into the lake. Bringing boats to the lake from other bodies of water introduces invasive seed spores that potentially populate the lake and causes maintenance problems for equipment.

The City of Concord Parks and Recreation Department has a small lake access area in the southeast corner of the lake and rents small fishing boats to the public. Bank fishing along the lake shoreline is prohibited.

Three defined drainage features cut through the park that may be considered jurisdictional. Prior to development a wetland determination should be prepared to confirm these drainage features are not jurisdictional. Any park development should be sensitive to wetland areas.

Lake Fisher along with the wetland areas provides many benefits to the park such as scenic value, the sound of flowing water, habitat for wildlife, and educational opportunities.

### Soils

According to the Cabarrus County soil survey prepared by the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service the soil composition for the site is comprised of three main soil types (EnD, EnB, and ChA,).



### EnD – Enon sandy loam, 2 to 8 percent

Farmland classification: Prime farmland of statewide importance Typical profile: varies from clay loam to loam from 0 to 80-inch depth Depth to water table: More than 80 inches, well drained Strength of soil: Low-special engineering required to strengthen soil Percent of site with this soil type: 55.5%+/-

### EnB – Enon sandy loam, 2 to 8 percent

Farmland classification: Prime farmland.

Typical profile: varies from fine sandy loam to loam from 0 to 80-inch depth

Depth to water table: More than 80 inches, well drained


Strength of soil: Low-special engineering required to strengthen soil

Percent of site with this soil type: 44%+/-

### ChA- Chewacla sandy loam, 0 to 2 percent slopes, frequently flooded.

Farmland classification: Prime farmland if drained or protected from flooding Typical profile: varies from loam to sandy loam from 0 to 80-inch depth Depth to water table: 6 to 24 inches, poorly draining Strength of soil: Low-special engineering required to strengthen soil Percent of site with this soil type: 0.5%+/-

The majority of the park is located in an area of existing woodlands. Properties associated with the soils will likely require special design considerations to improve strength of soils for any proposed infrastructure and recreation activity.

### Landform

The topography of Eastside park is flat with pockets of steeper slopes along the creek bank of Rocky River. Below is a general summary of slope across the park.

5-10%	27%

The topography for the site is suitable for recreation uses of any type. Grading operations will require a small of excavating and filling.

### SIGNIFICANT NATURAL COMMUNITIES

### **Predominant Vegetation**

The park site consists of mostly forested canopy and understory trees except along the sanitary sewer easement. The sewer easement consists of open grass field which are seasonally mowed during the growing season. Common species include Fescue, Bermuda, Clover, other native grasses, goldenrod, grama, beggarweed, wildflowers, and weeds.



The majority of the site is forest canopy and understory trees. Dominant woodland species include:

In addition to a diverse vegetative community, the park provides wonderful habitat for a variety of birds and wildlife.

### 2014 - 2024 PARKS AND RECREATION MASTER PLAN FOR KANNAPOLIS

The City's Park and Recreation Master Plan provided assessments and recommendations for it's existing park system.

The purpose of the Parks and Recreation Master Plan is to ensure that elected officials, parks and recreation staff, and citizen leaders have a road map to guide decision making and actions and to provide future generations with adequate parks, trails and open space.

The 2014 - 2024 Parks and Recreation Master Plan has made the following recommendations:

- Develop master plans for several of the City's existing and future parks, to include:
  - North Cabarrus Park
  - Village Park Master Plan Update
  - Bakers Creek Park
  - Future Community and Neighborhood Parks
    - Eastside Park
    - Westside Park
    - Forest Park
    - Howel Lake Park
- Public imput also emphasised the following facility needs:
  - Adult Baseball
  - Youth Baseball
  - Softball
  - Football
  - Soccer
  - Outdoor Basketball
  - Tennis
  - Volleyball
  - Shuffleboard
  - Horseshoes
  - Picnic Shelters
  - Playgrounds
  - Pedestrian Trails
  - Biking Trails
  - Amphitheaters and Neighborhood Performing Areas

The 2014 - 2024 Comprehensive Plan Capitol Improvement Budget included approximately \$15,562,740 for all of the recommended improvements.

### PARK PROGRAM

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Using the information from the site analysis, public workshops, discussion with park staff as well as the systemwide parks and recreation masterplan, the following top ten list of desired activities for the park have been established:

- **Paddleboats**
- Sidewalks to the park
- Dog Park
- Picnic Shelter/Picnic Areas
- **Nature Trails**
- Restroom
- **Paved Trails**
- Spraygrounds
- Seating Areas/Benches
- Playground



Public Workshop

With this program, a Preliminary Master Plan was developed that provided a passive park along the shoreline of Fisher Lake. The park provides paddle boating in the lake, a place for people and dogs to exercise and stay fit, trails for walking and running, playgrounds and spraygrounds, areas to sit and relax, and many other recreational activities.

### PROGRAM ELEMENTS / PHYSICAL NEEDS

### **Paddle Boating**

The public expressed strong interest for a variety of recreation activities at the park. Since this park is the only park in Kannapolis with water access, paddle boating was the most desirable activity. The public believes it is important to have some type of connection with Lake Fisher. A small floating dock will be constructed on the opposite end of the play meadow to provide a place to board and launch paddle boats. Lake Fisher is 534-acres in area and provides for very scenic paddle boating. Due to the size of the lake a floating buoy system will be installed to better define the limits of paddle boating for the public.

### **Trails**

There was strong interest in several types of walking trails including natural trails, paved trails, and sidewalks from adjacent neighborhoods to and from the park. Walking, Jogging, and biking through the parks open spaces, wooded areas, and along the shoreline of Lake Fisher will provide a scenic recreational experience for east Kannapolis. These trails along with strategically located seating areas will provide an opportunity to improve the health habits of Kannapolis citizens in a setting



that will provide physical and emotional well-being. The park will include a one-mile primary loop around the perimeter of the park routed through a variety of settings and connecting other recreation activities in the park. A seven-station outdoor fitness circuit has been located along the wooded portion of the park. For walkers preferring a shorter walk a one-third mile paved walking loop is located in the center of the park. The trail system has been designed in an inter-connected loop pattern. Trail segments routed through the wooded sections will have a natural surface while the trail segments located around the play meadow will have a paved surface. The trails will be constructed to provide an opportunity to walk freely in the woods and enjoy the surrounding natural beauty of Lake Fisher. All trails will be accessible for persons with disabilities.

### **Dog Park**

A fenced 2.35-acre dog park will be constructed adjacent to the parking area. The dog park will be divided into two areas. Large dogs will freely roam on 1.75 acres and small dogs will explore the remaining 0.60 acres. The dog park area will be supported by drinking fountains, park benches, and agility activities.

### **Picnic Shelters / Buildings**

An important element in the park development will be construction of several park buildings that will provide support services (restrooms, picnic tables, etc.) for park functions. Several picnic shelters of different sizes have been organized along the perimeter of the play meadow within site of the shoreline of Lake Fisher. A new restroom facility will be centrally located in the most active part of the park near the sprayground and adjacent to picnic shelters, playground, and dog park areas. The new picnic shelters will be connected by a series of accessible paths from the parking lot.

### Sprayground

Since swimming is not allowed in Lake Fisher an alternative water play activity is proposed for the park. A large zero-depth sprayground will be constructed. This sprayground will provide a wonderful outdoor activity without the operational and liability costs of a swimming pool. A small restroom will be constructed beside the sprayground. Numerous benches, tables, and other site furnishings will be designed around the sprayground to provide a safe and enjoyable place for both children and adults.

### **Playground**

The center piece of the park will be a new themed playground. The playground will provide a wide variety of play activities such as slides, swings, climbers, and be divided into age appropriate areas. The playground will feature an amazing one of a kind slide area. Two separate parallel slides will be designed into the hill side where two kids can race side by side to the bottom of the hill. Play equipment and play surfacing. will meet designed to meet all accessibility, ASTM, and CPSC requirements.

### **Parking**

Playgrounds, picnic shelters, dog parks, trails, and other recreational activities function best when parking is reasonably accessible. Carrying

picnic baskets and supplies log distances greatly diminishes use and restricts access to those with mobility challenges. Roads and parking provide park visitors the means to access the new recreational facilities. A 94+/- space parking lot will be constructed in a centrally located area of the property and will provide visitors convenient access to the lake and recreational facilities.

### **Play Meadow**

Open greenspace is in high demand for rapidly growing communities like Kannapolis. Park development will include a strategically located one-acre Play Meadow in the center of the park. Situated at the terminus of the main park drive with scenic views of the Lake Fisher shoreline the play meadow will provide an attractive focal point in the park. It is sized large enough to allow for unorganized play such as football, frisbee, soccer, baseball, and other lawn games. A paved loop trail defines the play meadow and allows visitors to get to the play meadow. Several picnic shelters, playground, sprayground, and paddle boat dock are distributed around the play meadow. People going to and from these recreation activities through and around the play meadow will create a busy energetic park.

### Wildflower/Pollinator Garden

The park provides a great opportunity to plant native grass and wildflower gardens. In addition to making the park more attractive these wildflower meadows will help stabilize the landscape, decrease maintenance, provide food for birds and insects, and be a great outdoor learning lab for the public. Several native brightly flowered wildflower gardens will be planted in the park.

### PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT / RECREATIONAL NEEDS

### CONCEPT DEVELOPMENT / PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT


Two separate public workshops were held for Eastside Park. Each workshop was publicized on the City's webpage and Facebook.

Each workshop was scheduled for approximately two hours; however, people could arrive and leave the workshop as their schedules would allow, while still having the opportunity to participate to the fullest extent. The public could move individually through "information stations" at their own pace. Park and Recreation staff and the Planning Consultant monitored the stations, noted feedback, and answered questions.

### Public Workhop #1

At the first workshop the public viewed site analysis maps, viewed character images of recreation activities and provided input on activities they would like to see at Eastside Park.

The first community workshop was held March 26, 2019 from 6-8pm at the Laureate Center in Kannapolis City Hall. Forty-Two citizens attended the workshop. Several members from City Council ere in attendance. Staff from Benesch (the park planning consultant) and the City's Parks and Recreation Department facilitated the workshop and were available to discuss the project with the public.



Program Element Preferences



The format of the workshop was an informal drop in style public workshop. Following sign in, attendees were invited to review display boards that provided information on existing conditions information on the site (hydrology, soils, slopes, etc.) and ask questions about the site and the City's future plans to develop the new park. The park planning consultant explained this site is more suitable for passive recreational activities because of the terrain, mostly wooded site, and proximity to Lake Fisher.

Following their review of the existing conditions information, attendees were invited to consider a list of potential recreational activities that are typically found in a park. The recreational activities list also had a display showing picture examples of the different types of recreational activities to help educate the public on different types of activities and to help generate ideas.

Attendees were given 4 adhesive dots (orange and green) and asked to identify the activities that they felt should be included on the park master plan. In addition to providing a list of appropriate facilities/activities, attendees were instructed that they could add any facilities/activities they felt should be included in the plan that were not listed on the display.

Several attendees asked about when the park might be developed. They were informed that the City does have immediate plans for park development. The plan is to complete the Master Plan by Summer 2019 and then apply for grants in 2020. Once funding has been secured, plans will be designed, bids solicited, followed by construction. The park would be opened in 3-4 years. Attendees were informed that a second community workshop will be held in four to six weeks to get feedback on the preliminary masterplan.

Generally, everyone attending the workshop was supportive of park development and felt that recreational facilities would be well used by those living in the area. Several attendees from the surrounding neighborhoods expressed excitement about the dog park.

Based on input from attendees, the following facilities were listed as the top priorities (in order of preference):

- 1. Paddleboats
- 2. Sidewalks to the park
- 3. Dog Park
- 4. Picnic Shelter/Picnic Areas
- 5. Nature Trails
- 6. Restroom
- 7. Paved Trails
- 8. Spraygrounds
- 9. Seating Areas/Benches
- 10. Fishing Access
- 11. Playground
- 12. Access for Kayaking
- 13. Disc Golf
- 14. Osprey Platforms on Lake Fisher
- 15. Outdoor Fitness Equipment



- 16. Community Garden
- 17. Open Space/Natural Areas
- 18. High Ropes Course
- 19. Horseshoes
- 20. Basketball
- 21. Nature Playground
- Shuffleboard 22.

In addition to "voting" on recreational facilities for future park development, attendees were invited to provide written comments with regard to the park master plan. The following comments were made by citizens:

- "Osprey nesting platforms on Lake Fisher are needed. They are currently attempting to nest atop the cell phone tower behind Charity Baptist Church (300 feet up!!)"
- "Many would like to shore fish. Nearest lakes are Norman and High Rock!! Maybe a fishing pier on Lakeside trail"
- "Entrance?? traffic flow sidewalks"
- "If paddleboats can be permitted, can kayaking also be allowed?"
- "Dog park split into 3 sections small, medium, large/XL dogs. Also more acreage! Would be great to incorporate agility equipment as well.
- "Community Garden incorporate pollinator friendly area like at Frank Liske. Incorporate education as part of garden."
- "Dog park 2 sections for sure large and small dog area, lots of shade, water area with circulation for water/pond area. Drinking fountain area for dogs, receptacles and baggies please. Picnic tables and/or benches in sun and shade."
- "Fishing area/access, lessons?"
- "Community Garden..."
- "Paddle boats super idea"
- "Nature trails and look outs, osprey nesting and nature area. Still would like for land to be considered across from First Baptist Church along Fairview where Old WRKB radio station is. Carl Ford, Martha Macon has stated would consider selling acres. One other lady owns some of the land also."
- Lake access
- Basketball hoops
- Access to homes around lake, fencing?
- Water gets very low in summer
- Look at seasonably high/low water table (proposed boat area low in summer)
- Midlake Ave acts as a cut through, heavy traffic
- Sidewalks
- Detention pond
- Educational programs

Overall, the workshop was well attended and provided very good information with regard to desired activities and park development concerns. Input from the workshop was used to develop a program for park development and a preliminary plan for the park.

### Public Workshop #2

At the second workshop the public reviewed preliminary master plans, heard a brief presentation from



Benesch, and provided feedback on the preliminary plans. At the final workshop the public reviewed the final master plan. A detailed summary of each workshop is in the Appendix section of this document.

The second community workshop was held May 14, 2019 from 6:30-8:00 pm at the Laureate Center at City Hall. Thirteen people attended the Workshop. Staff from Benesch (the park planning consultant) and the City's Parks and Recreation Department facilitated the workshop and were available to discuss the project with attendees. Several members of the Parks and Recreation Commission were in attendance.

The format of the workshop was once again an informal drop in. Following sign in, attendees were invited to review display boards from the first community workshop that provided information on existing conditions on the site (man-made features, soils, slopes, etc.) and ask questions regarding the site and the City's future plans to develop a park. Following their review of existing conditions information, attendees were invited to consider a conceptual site plan derived from input gathered at the first community workshop. An image board was also presented that displayed the elements shown within the conceptual plan.

As part of their orientation attendees were informed that the master planning process would be completed by the end of June, with a presentation of the final master plan along with a cost estimate to the Parks & Recreation Commission. Upon a recommendation from the Parks & Recreation Commission, the plan will be presented to City Council for acceptance and direction.

Everyone attending the workshop were all very supportive of the conceptual plan as presented and asked how soon the park would be developed and added to Kannapolis' park system.

Comments were made regarding facilities not shown in the conceptual plan:

- Add fencing in the old road bed in the curve of Lake Fisher road to prevent people from cutting through yards to get to the park.
- Let's go build it!


### **Community Survey**

An important component of the public input process was an online community survey that was distributed to the citizens of Kannapolis. This survey included a question about desired park development at Westside Park. The full results of the survey is included in the exhibits at the end of this document. 337 responses were recorded.

The returned survey information provided valuable information on the community's desire and interest in new facilities. The following is a summary of the response to the first question:

Please rank the following park amenities in order of preference that you would like to see in the Eastside Park. (This is the park near Lake Fisher). The percentage of responses listing the amenity as their top choice is shown. (See the full survey results in the Exhibits at the end of this document).

### RECREATIONAL NEEDS

The City of Kannapolis recognizes the importance of this park in meeting the recreational needs of the public. The closest park for citizens on the Eastside of Kannapolis is several miles away in the downtown area.

The development program for Eastside Park will provide recreation activities that are close to home, popular with the surrounding neighborhoods, and work well for the site. The master plan meets walking needs by providing a trail system that has multiple walking options of various distances, is safe, user friendly, and attractive. The trail along the lake shoreline and through the woods is a great way for the community to stay healthy.

The Eastside Park Master Plan includes a pier for paddleboats. This facility will provide Kannapolis with it's first and only park with water access. Paddle boating appeals to the young and young at heart. It is an activity that people of all ages will enjoy.

Kannapolis has a need for a dog park. The public has requested a dog park for many years. Eastside park provides Kannapolis with it's first dog park. A new dog park will provide a facility for both people and dogs to socialize, unleash, and unwind.

The masterplan proposes and new playground and sprayground. Presently Kannapolis has one sprayground in the downtown area. It is heavily used by the general public, camps, daycare, and other groups. Having another sprayground will help the city keep up with the strong demand for water play. The kids on the east side need a place to play.

Kannapolis has a need for a passive park where the public can experience nature. The park offers benches for wildlife viewing and trails through the woods and along Lake Fisher. Wildlife and native grass demonstration areas will be planted for instruction.

### MAINTENANCE / OPERATIONS

Operating, maintaining, and managing Eastside Park will require a coordinated effort by the Parks and Recreation Department. Development of new facilities will require additional staff to keep the park safe, attractive, and clean. Lake activities will be limited to daylight hours. Gated entrances and selective security fencing will control use of the park after hours. A staff person will man the sprayground concession/ticket building to monitor entry and exit to and from the sprayground. Staff will be responsible for paddle boat rentals and make sure all users wear a life vest.

The proposed park provides many new revenue generation opportunities through facility rentals and program fees.

Staff will patrol the park, provide assistance to visitors regarding the proper use of facilities, and deter acts of vandalism and destruction. Staff will coordinate shelter rentals, spray ground admission and concessions.



Additional manpower possibly on full time or part time basis should be considered to maintain a quality level of service for park visitors. Developing a new park will increase the amount of maintenance for the overall park system.

### **ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE CONSTRUCTION / PARK OPERATION**

Eastside Park provides an important environmental asset to the community by preserving land and water resources. The preservation of existing trees and vegetation improves air quality and water quality. The preservation of existing wetlands, the protection of buffers along the shoreline, and controlling run-off into the lake improve water quality. These natural resources serve as a filtration system for water leaving the surrounding areas.

As a public agency, Kannapolis recognizes its role in environmental protection and plans to develop the facilities at Eastside with minimal environmental impact. While the details for minimizing the environmental impact of park construction and operations will be worked out in subsequent design phases, some of the design principles that will be encouraged include:

- Comply with Class 1 Reservoir requirements for public access as outlined by NC Division of Water Quality
- Comply with requirements of the Army Corps of Engineers
- Site planning to minimize grading and the removal of existing vegetation
- Balance earth movement to minimize haul off/haul on transportation costs/fuel
- Maintain required buffers to protect water quality
- Use local building materials
- Utilize energy efficient lighting
- Use storm water control measures to filter run-off
- Plant wildflower and native grasses

### **BUDGET ESTIMATE SUMMARY**

The next step in the planning process is to determine order of magnitude cost for proposed improvements. In order to develop project cost, quantity estimates were prepared for all proposed improvements shown on the park master plan. The quantity take-offs (linear foot of trails, square footage of picnic shelters, etc.) were then applied to unit construction cost to develop an order of magnitude cost estimates for park improvements.

The development of a 33-acre park is quite an undertaking. While detailed plans (architectural, grading, drainage, etc.) is beyond the scope of this report, the master plan that has been established provides a basis for preliminary cost estimation.

Using the master plan the anticipated cost of the project (in 2019 dollars) is \$3.9 +/- million. A summary of these costs is provided.
