EVIDENTIARY HEARING

BOA-2025-17 - Request for a Special Use Permit (SUP) Submitted by Kristi Harrington to allow for a private school on property located at 2204 Summit Ave.

Mr. Barcroft gave a presentation regarding case BOA-2025-17, which was entered into the record as Exhibit 1. He stated that the applicant is Kristi Harrington, the site comprises approximately seven acres, and the request is for a permit to allow a private school. He explained that the proposal involves utilizing an existing building on a church campus for a private K-12

40 school; the building is currently used for Sunday school classrooms.

- 41 Mr. Barcroft noted that the building proposed for the school is located entirely within the
- Residential 8 (R8) zoning district, while the east side of the site lies within the General
- Commercial (GC) district. He further detailed that the R8 portion of the site falls within the
- 44 Urban Residential future land use designation, where the primary uses consist of single-family

- 1 and civic uses and the secondary uses include multifamily, small-format retail/office, and live-
- 2 work. The GC portion of the site falls within the Urban Corridor future land use designation,
- 3 with primary uses including retail, office, and multifamily, and secondary uses including
- 4 institutional, light manufacturing, and single-family attached residences.
- 5 Mr. Barcroft then presented the site plan submitted by the applicant, identifying the proposed
- 6 building for the school and outlining a previous planned traffic circulation plan. He also
- 7 demonstrated the street views from Westview Street and Summit Avenue, shared drone footage,
- 8 and presented the updated traffic circulation plan. Mr. Barcroft reviewed staff Findings of Fact as
- 9 follows:

 1. The proposed conditional use will be in harmony with the area in which it is to be located and in general conformance with the City's Land Use Plan.

This property is in the "Urban Residential" and the "Urban Corridor" Character Areas in the Move Kannapolis Forward 2030 Comprehensive Plan. The specific building proposed to be used for the school lies solely within the "Urban Residential" area. The building and site are currently used as a place of worship, with surrounding uses consisting primarily of single-family residential dwellings. The applicant states that the proposed private school will serve as a natural extension of the existing church, providing a seamless transition for students advancing from preschool into the private school.

Based on the character areas noted above, the proposed development is compatible with the future land use plan and existing uses in the surrounding area.

2. Adequate measures shall be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed as to minimize traffic hazards and to minimize traffic congestion on the public roads. The applicant states that the property has adequate on-site parking and an existing drive-thru to facilitate drop-off and pick-up without interfering with traffic on surrounding roads. A traffic circulation sketch has been provided to ensure that vehicles queuing for student drop-off remain on-site and do not spill onto adjacent streets.

It has been determined that the existing church provides sufficient parking to support the proposed school use, even at a maximum capacity of 10 staff, 70 K–9 students, and 30 grade 10–12 students. The education building contains 10 spaces, while the church provides an additional 122 paved spaces.

Per code requirements, parking must be provided at a ratio of 1 space per 8 K–9 students and 1 space per 2 grade 10–12 students. Based on the information provided, these requirements have been met.

3. The proposed use shall not be noxious or offensive by reason of vibration, noise, odor, dust, smoke or gas.

No vibration, noise, odor, dust, smoke, or gas beyond what would be anticipated for a private school is expected as a result of this proposed use.

4. The establishment of the proposed use shall not impede the orderly development and improvement of surrounding property for uses permitted within the zoning district.

The proposed use would not impede development of the surrounding properties for uses allowed within their respective zoning districts. The proposed private school is compatible with the existing and surrounding uses.

5. The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the proposed use shall not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, or general welfare.

There is no apparent danger or detriment to the overall public safety, health and welfare resulting from the proposed use. The proposed use is subject to all the requirements of the Kannapolis Development Ordinance.

6. The proposed use complies with all applicable provisions of the KDO.

The proposed use shall comply with all sections of the Kannapolis Development Ordinance, conditions of approval, and any other applicable local, state and Federal regulations. It is understood by the applicant that unless specifically relieved of a requirement, in writing, all KDO requirements must be met.

7. The applicant consents in writing to all conditions of approval included in the approved special use permit.

The applicant has indicated that they will sign all Conditions of Approval for this special use permit.

- Mr. Barcroft stated staff recommends approval of the Special Use Permit based on the staff Findings of Fact (or as modified by the Board), the conceptual site plan, and compliance with all local, state and federal requirements. He then made himself available for questions.
- Mr. Bailey commented that the presentation was very detailed and covered adequate information. 27
- There being no additional questions or comments for staff, the applicant was asked to step forward. 28
- 29 Kristi Harrington, 305 Cooper Rd., discussed that there is a need for private Christian education in the area with many individuals looking for private schools. 30
- There being no additional questions or comments for staff or the applicant, Chair Joshi opened the hearing which was then closed due to no one present to speak. 32
- Chair Joshi asked for a motion to accept the City's exhibits into the record, which was made by Mr. Sides, second by Mr. Parker and the motion was unanimously approved. 34
- Chair Joshi asked for a motion to approve the Findings of Fact. Mr. Bailey made the motion to 35 approve the Findings of Fact, second by Mr. Dwiggins, and the motion was unanimously approved.
- Chair Joshi asked for a motion to approve the issuance of the Special Use Permit. Mr. Dwiggins 37 made the motion to approve, second by Mr. Sides, and the motion was unanimously approved.
- Chair Joshi asked for a motion to issue the Order of Approval. Mr. Sides made the motion to 39 approve order, second by Mr. Parker, and the motion was unanimously approved.

- 1 BOA-2025-18 Appeal of the Planning Director's interpretation of Section 5.9 Sign
- 2 Standards, Table 5.9.E(1)a: Standards for Sign Number, Area and Height in the GC
- 3 District. the Kannapolis Development Ordinance submitted by Heather English
- 4 Mr. Barcroft gave a presentation regarding case BOA-2025-18, which was entered into the
- 5 record as Exhibit 2. He stated that the applicant is Heather English, the site is located at 2815 N.
- 6 Cannon Boulevard, and the parcel is approximately 1.17 acres in size. He further noted that the
- 7 site is located within the General Commercial (GC) zoning district.
- 8 Mr. Barcroft explained that the applicant is appealing the Planning Director's interpretation of
- 9 Section 5.9, Sign Standards, Table 5.9.E(1)(a): Standards for Sign Number, Area, and Height in
- 10 the GC District. Staff determined that the requested wall sign must be reduced to no more than
- one (1) square foot per linear foot of wall.
- 12 He elaborated that Table 5.9.E(1)(a) specifies the following standard under the "Sign Area Max
- 13 (SQ. FT.)" column for wall signs in the GC District: one (1) square foot per linear foot of the
- 14 width of the building façade to which the wall sign is attached, not to exceed 120 square feet or
- 15 10 percent of the area of the facade. The applicant submitted a wall sign measuring 69.13 square
- 16 feet on a wall that is 52 feet in length. Based on the maximum allowance of one (1) square foot
- per linear foot, the permitted sign area would be limited to 52 square feet.
- 18 Mr. Barcroft referred to Table 5.9.E(1)(a) to discuss wall sign standards for individual businesses
- and combined developments, noting that one sign is permitted per frontage. He presented the
- submitted site plan and clarified that only the proposed sign on the north side of the building is
- 21 subject to the appeal, Mr. Barcroft also displayed the proposed elevation plan for the new tire
- shop, reiterating that the size of the proposed sign is 69.13 square feet.
- 23 Mr. Barcroft reviewed the policy and action requested as follows:
- 24 Section 2.5.D(4)a. of the KDO states: "Any person who has standing under N.C.G.S. Section
- 25 160D-1402 or the City may appeal a decision made by the Planning Director or Director of
- 26 Engineering in carrying out a power or duty granted by this Ordinance, including any final and
- 27 binding order, requirement, or determination, to the Board of Adjustment in accordance with the
- 28 procedures and standards in this section and state law."
- 29 The Board of Adjustment should consider all facts and testimony after conducting the public
- 30 hearing and render a decision accordingly to affirm or reverse the decision of the Planning
- 31 Director.
- 32 Actions Requested:
- 33 Motion to accept the City's exhibits into the record.
- 34 Motion to affirm (wholly or partly) the decision, modify the decision, or reverse the decision.
- 35 Mr. Barcroft then made himself available for questions.
- 36 Ms. Joshi asked Mr. Lee if the hearing will still need to be opened for appeal cases. Mr. Lee said
- 37 that the hearing will need to be opened to allow the applicant to present.

- 1 There being no additional questions or comments for staff, the applicant was asked to step forward.
- 2 Heather English, P.O. Box 363 Pleasant Garden, NC, said she is from Permit Solutions and will
- 3 be presenting on behalf of Mavis Tires and Brakes which is the business that will be occupying
- 4 the site and proposing the sign.
- 5 Ms. Joshi asked if a representative from Mavis Tires and Brakes was present. Ms. English
- 6 responded that she was present to represent Mavis Tires and Brakes. Ms. Joshi explained that
- 7 because the Board of Adjustment meeting is a quasi-judicial proceeding, only an attorney may
- 8 speak on behalf of the applicant. She clarified that Ms. English could provide factual information
- 9 related to the case but could not argue for an appeal or propose changes to the Kannapolis
- 10 Development Ordinance (KDO).
- Ms. Joshi further stated that if the request involves reconsideration of staff's interpretation of the
- Ordinance or a decision by the Board to modify how the Ordinance was applied, legal
- 13 representation would be required to make that argument.
- 14 Ms. English expressed that she wished this requirement had been communicated to her when she
- submitted the application in July. She explained that she is a professional expediter but not an
- attorney, and that staff had not provided any instructions indicating that legal representation
- would be necessary. She noted that this information would have allowed her client to evaluate
- whether to retain an attorney for the hearing.
- Ms. Joshi advised that the Board could consider a continuance to provide the applicant additional
- 20 time to obtain legal representation, should the applicant wish to pursue a change in staff's
- 21 interpretation of the KDO.
- 22 Mr. Lee asked Ms. English if she worked for the sign company. Ms. English replied that she is a
- 23 third-party permit expediter and ordinance research consultant hired by sign companies and
- 24 developers, with twenty years of experience.
- 25 Mr. Lee stated that, legally, Ms. English is not a party to the case because she is neither the
- property owner nor the applicant, and therefore not a direct representative of the business entity.
- Ms. English responded that she is an agent of the sign company, which in turn serves as an agent
- 28 of Mavis Tires and Brakes.
- 29 Mr. Lee informed Ms. English that she could provide information regarding the proposed sign
- 30 but could not argue whether staff had correctly applied the Ordinance. He added that, while he
- 31 would not offer legal advice, one option would be to allow her to present factual information
- 32 while keeping the case open.
- 33 Ms. English stated that she was uncertain how to proceed, as staff had advised her to apply for an
- 34 appeal. She further explained that the applicant could have applied for a variance, which she
- believed was the appropriate course, but during her pre-application discussions with Mr. Barcroft
- and Mr. Smith, she was instructed to pursue an appeal instead.
- 37 Ms. Joshi asked Mr. Lee to clarify when he said Ms. English can make her statements and leave
- the case open. Mr. Lee said that Ms. English can present factual information and the case can be
- 39 continued until the next meeting to allow time for the applicant to obtain an attorney. Ms.

- 1 English said she had submitted an application under the direction of staff with it being over a
- 2 month since the original application.
- 3 Mr. Smith clarified that an applicant may apply for a variance if the requirements, such as
- 4 demonstrating a hardship, are met; however, this case was submitted as an interpretation of the
- 5 Ordinance.
- 6 Ms. Joshi informed Ms. English that it was her decision whether to proceed and present factual
- 7 information for the case. Ms. English responded that she could withhold her opinion and limit
- 8 her presentation to factual testimony, noting that she had asked Mr. Barcroft to present Table
- 9 5.9.E(1)(a) as the basis of her study and testimony.
- 10 Ms. Joshi clarified that testimony regarding Table 5.9.E(1)(a) would constitute an opinion on the
- 11 application of the KDO, as it involves interpretation of the Ordinance rather than the purpose of
- the sign, hardships, or other factual information. She further stated that addressing differences
- between staff's interpretation and the applicant's interpretation would require representation by a
- 14 licensed attorney.
- 15 Ms. Joshi advised Ms. English to consult with the applicant regarding whether they wished to
- obtain legal counsel who could use the information she had prepared and provide representation
- 17 if the case were continued to the next month's meeting. Ms. English stated that she would request
- a continuance, as she believed it was her only option given that her case was based entirely on
- 19 differing interpretations of the Ordinance language.
- 20 Ms. Joshi asked for a motion to continue the case to the October Board of Adjustment meeting.
- 21 Mr. Sides made a motion to continue this case to the October meeting, second by Mr. Dwiggins,
- 22 and the motion was unanimously approved.

23 PLANNING DIRECTOR UPDATES

- 24 Ms. Joshi asked if the bridge near the K Town Cars will be rebuilt. Mr. Smith said the bridge will
- 25 be rebuilt and improved. He mentioned that often NCDOT will hire a company to demolish the
- bridge, while another company will be hired to build the bridge. Mr. Smith added that recently
- 27 City Council has discussed the naming of the bridge as well as another bridge on Rogers Lake
- 28 Road.
- 29 Mr. Smith welcomed Ms. McClain and mentioned she is the new ETJ representative. He clarified
- 30 that the acronym ETJ, stands for Extra Territorial Jurisdiction which is the area outside of the
- 31 City limits but still under the Kannapolis zoning jurisdiction. Mr. Smith also said the ETJ region
- 32 is in Rowan County and no ETJ area exists in Cabarrus County. Kannapolis had zoning prior to
- 33 Rowan County which enabled the ETJ region. Mr. Smith mentioned that Ms. McClain's husband
- 34 is a former Board member and currently serves on the Planning and Zoning Commission.
- 35 Mr. Smith presented the story map to the Board. He explained that the department's website
- 36 features two maps: one displaying development on a map of the city, and the other—a story
- 37 map—that organizes projects by section or type, such as industrial, residential, and civic. He
- 38 demonstrated that by clicking on each category individually, project thumbnails will appear.

- 1 Mr. Smith highlighted the Industrial section, pointing out 85 Exchange off Kannapolis Parkway,
- 2 noting the project continues to grow as Amazon increases its presence in the area. He also
- 3 discussed Gateway Business Park and LakeShore Corporate Park, where Chick-fil-A is
- 4 expanding its presence. Metro 63 is projected to be occupied by the end of the year. On Stanley
- 5 Drive, a new building has been completed by the same company that purchased the Stanley
- 6 Black & Decker Distribution Center. Expansion of this development is expected to begin in 2026
- 7 or early 2027, with a sewer allocation permit already granted to the developer.
- 8 Mr. Smith also noted that Stolz Services, which has operated on Lane Street for several years,
- 9 requested annexation when relocating in order to remain within Kannapolis city limits. Similarly,
- the Wayne Brothers Training Facility has additional property that was recently annexed into the
- 11 City
- Moving to the Residential section of the story map, Mr. Smith reported that more than 6,000
- residential units have been approved, with over half being multifamily. However, going forward,
- residential projects will be considered on a case-by-case basis, as City Council has directed staff
- 15 to prioritize non-residential development.
- Mr. Smith added that 200 S. Main Street is expected to be completed by the end of the year,
- while Coldwater Ridge II will include 72 affordable housing units. He also noted that Stadium
- Lofts Phase I is completed, with Phase II anticipated to begin development in a few years.
- 19 Ms. Joshi asked about Steiny Houses on Cornelia St. Mr. Smith replied it is a tiny house
- 20 neighborhood which was developed by a Planning and Zoning Commission member. Mr. Bailey
- asked where the neighborhood is located. Mr. Smith said the development is near 8th St.,
- 22 Mountain St., and the YMCA.
- 23 Mr. Smith went over to the Civic section of the story map and mentioned he has received
- 24 multiple inquiries about the new Northwest Cabarrus High School. Depending on state
- budgeting, construction of the school may start in 2027. He also mentioned the Cabarrus County
- 26 Library and Active Living Center and that Altar Global HQ is in the former Kannapolis
- 27 Recreation Park.
- 28 Mr. Parker inquired about the Kannapolis train station platform that has been under development
- 29 for the last few years. Mr. Smith said staff is waiting on Norfolk Southern and North Carolina
- 30 Railroad to decide what else is needed from the City to determine encroachments/railroad right-
- of-way. Construction was previously planned to start last July. Mr. Parker asked if a parking
- 32 garage is planned. Mr. Smith replied that a parking garage is not included in the plans, but there
- is a shared agreement between the City and NCDOT to build a parking lot that will not only
- 34 serve the train station but other sites nearby such as Vida and 200 Main. Mr. Smith noted that the
- 35 trees will be preserved.
- 36 Mr. Smith went to the commercial section of the Story map and mentioned the Caliber Collision
- development and Lowes Foods which should be open to the public around May 2026. He also
- 38 mentioned the Marriott Hotel which will have its own linear park and Zaxby's. Mr. Smith then
- 39 went to the mixed-use section of the story map and explained that mixed-use often consists of
- 40 non-residential and residential projects mixed/combined. Loop Yard is located off Dale Earnhardt
- Blvd. and will include around 161 townhomes as well as a medical use building and a shopping

- 1 center. He discussed that Millstone Village will consist of a Harris Teeter grocery store, retail
- 2 units, and a separate building designated for a bank or restaurant while Phase II includes
- 3 approximately 160 townhomes and an over 300-unit apartment community.
- 4 Mr. Bailey asked if there is a picture of Rogers Lake showing the train tracks. Mr. Smith replied
- 5 there is a NCDOT drawing but not an aerial view. Mr. Bailey asked if there is a timeline for the
- 6 Rogers Lake bridge. Mr. Smith said the bridge might be completed late next year, and had been
- 7 delayed due to miscalculations.
- 8 Mr. Sides asked if NCDOT is responsible for landscaping. Mr. Smith replied that NCDOT is
- 9 responsible for landscaping with improvements and should be seen with the completions of the
- 10 bridge on Rogers Lake Road as well as the one on Martin Luther King Blvd.
- 11 Mr. Parker mentioned that he has been told by many citizens that there are no lights in the
- 12 parking lot off the research campus and was wondering how to request lights for the parking lot.
- 13 Mr. Smith answered that the property owner for the research campus may change in the near
- 14 future and that there has been discussions on possibly the City owning the property where the
- 15 research campus is located.

The proposal involves the use of an existing building that is part of a church campus for a private K–12 school. The building is currently utilized for Sunday School classrooms.

Pursuant to Table 4.2.B(5) of the Kannapolis Development Ordinance (KDO), issuance of a SUP is required for a private school in the R8 zoning district.

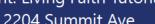






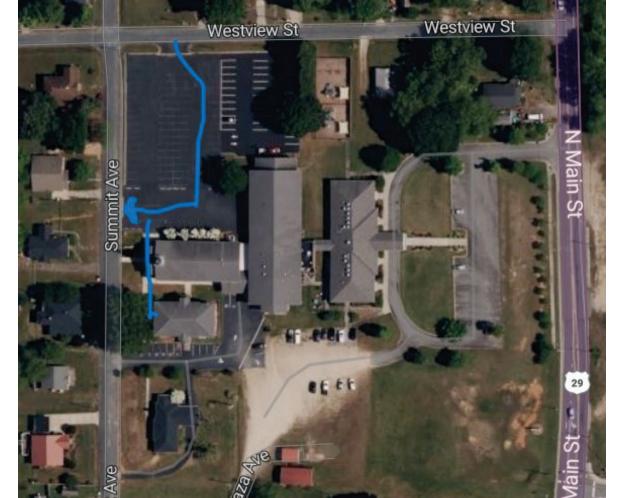
Kannapolis 2030 Future Land Use Map

C. Background

The applicant, Heather English, is appealing the Planning Director's interpretation of Section 5.9, Sign Standards, Table 5.9.E(1)(a) regarding the number, area, and height of signs in the GC (General Commercial) district. Staff has determined that the requested wall sign must be reduced to no more than one (1) square foot per linear foot of wall. The property is located at 2815 N. Cannon Blvd., more specifically identified as Rowan County Parcel Identification Number 133 228. The property is zoned General Commercial (GC) and is approximately 1.17 +/- acres.

Table 5.9.E(1)(a) specifies the following standard under the Sign Area Max (SQ. FT.) column for wall signs in the GC District:

1 sq. ft. per linear foot of the width of the building to which the wall sign is attached, not to exceed 120 sq. ft. or 10 percent of the area of the façade to which the wall sign is attached.

The applicant submitted a wall sign measuring 69.13 square feet on a wall that is 52 feet in length. Based on the maximum allowance of one (1) square foot of sign area per linear foot of wall, the sign would be limited to 52 square feet.

Re: Appeal Application for Interpretation of Wall Signage Allowance for GC Districts

Dear City Planning Department & Board Members,

I have been working with Allen Industries and Mavis Tire & Brakes to permit signage for the new site being constructed at 2815 N Cannon Blvd there in Kannapolis. Our client Mavis Southeast performed sign ordinance due diligence early in their development process and had preselected the signs for this property based on those results. It is our understanding that the allowance for wall attached signage as it is stated verbatim in Section 5.9 City Sign Standards is as follows: 1 Sq Ft per linear foot of width of the building to which wall sign is attached, not to exceed 120 Sq Ft. or 10 percent of the area of the façade to which wall sign is attached. The exact text of the ordinance provides (2) clear calculation formulas for the wall sign area allowed. Our client selected sign sizes for this site based upon the 10% formula; however, upon permit review, staff has indicated that sign area must comply with both calculations.

I have been immersed in the sign industry for a little over 20 years and have read and continue to read many sign ordinances on a daily basis. Typically when a jurisdiction provides (2) calculation formulas for allowable sign area there is a qualifier that follows whether that be "whichever formula is less" or "whichever formula gives a greater result." The 1 Sq Ft per linear foot of wall width calculation and the 10% formula allowances are both on the conservative side when looking at the majority of sign area calculations across other jurisdictions. We can look at specific wall examples, but I assert that the 1:1 ratio will mostly always give you a smaller result for allowed signage area such that it becomes an irrelevant calculation. Given that this zoning district is the one with the highest level of commercial uses, it stands to reason that the sign allowances should be the greatest for this area but also kept within a reasonable amount. I believe the intent of the ordinance was to allow a business either 1 Sq Ft of sign area for each linear foot of wall width OR 10% of the wall area whichever may be more limited to 120 Sq Ft maximum.

I look forward to discussing this with all in more detail as I prepare these preapplication materials for the meeting tomorrow as well as the Board meeting in September. We appreciate everyone's careful consideration to this request as we endeavor to serve our business clients and to help them have successful operations there in Kannapolis.

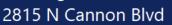

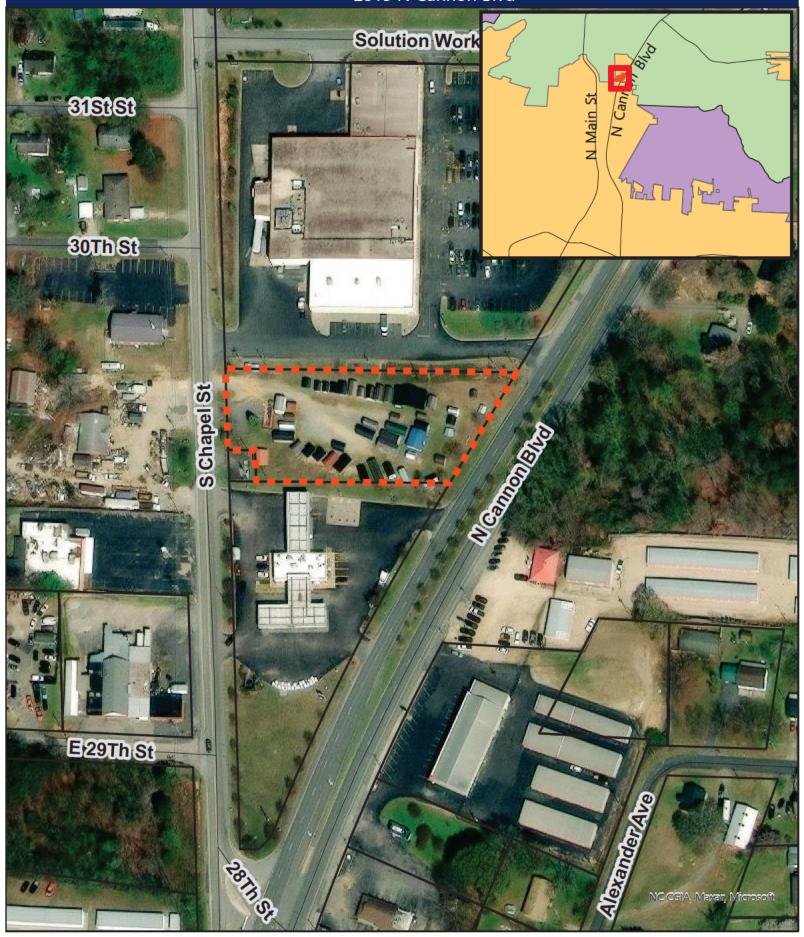


Vicinity Map Case Number: BOA-2025-18

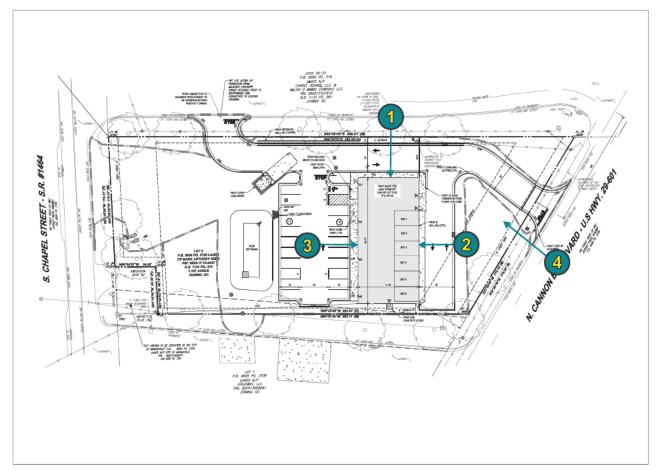
